VISION 2022 :

RE-ENGINEERING NATION BUILDING PROCESS by CMAs

Over the last couple of years, the Government has launched several fast-paced reforms that have transformed India into one of the fastest growing economies in the world. The major reforms undertaken are Digital India, Make in India, Skill India, Smart Cities, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojna, 24x7 - Power for All, JAM Trinity, Startup India, Goods and Services Tax (GST), etc. The Government has now set targets in the form of Vision 2022 to emerge as 'a new inclusive India' for poor, middle class and women to continue the growth path through the proper reform measures. The recent initiatives taken by Government of India in the last three consecutive years lead the nation as Global Leader. The reform measures taken by GoI / mainly through three landmark initiatives - Make in India, Demonetization and Goods and Services Tax. All these three economic re-engineering processes have been interlinked with common people at every sphere economic activities of the country

Vision 2022

A 'new inclusive India' for poor, middle class and women. Hon'ble Prime Minister explained his idea of a New India and Indians, saying it should be a country that offers opportunities to all in the transformed manner that would give way for development in the years to come.

Make in India, Demonetization and Goods and Services Tax have a direct role to professionals by involving themselves in the process of Nation Building. In particular, CMA's role are much imperative in the above linkages.

Make in India - Transforming India into a manufacturing magnet. The *Make in India* initiatives aims to transform India into a global design and manufacturing hub. The initiative aims to build best-in-class manufacturing infrastructure by enabling investments, boosting innovation, encouraging skill development and strengthening intellectual property protection.

Demonetization - Demonetization drive has been able to tackle the menace of counterfeit currency and reveal the amount of undisclosed income. This surgical strike has tackled all three malaises plaguing the economy, i.e a parallel economy that casted its ugly shadow on the nation's economy for long.

Goods and Services Tax (GST) - GST aims to simplify the Indian tax structure by introducing one indirect tax for

the entire nation aimed at making India one unified common market. The stakeholders of GST have a very high expectation about the positive outcome of GST. GST will bring uniformity and long-term perspective to the indirect tax structure in India.

India is set on a growth trajectory that promises an inclusive growth, all-round development, economic welfare and strong macro economic indicators. All these radical reforms are acting as enablers for boosting the domestic environment which in turn is improving the country's stature globally. The government needs to continuously invest in improving the ease of doing business environment, develop sound infrastructure, and ensure availability of trained workforce. Reforms like "Power for All", "Smart Cities", "Skill India" and "Startup India" are expected to work in tandem with "Make in India" to help the country achieve the goal of becoming a manufacturing hub.
